# **About the Knight-Hennessy Scholars Program**

- A new graduate-level scholarship at Stanford University
  - Open to ANY graduate or professional degree program
- Aimed at preparing the next generation of global leader to tackle the increasingly complex challenges facing the world
- Seeking high-achieving students who are independent thinkers, purposeful leaders, and civicminded individuals
- Currently recruiting for the 2<sup>nd</sup> cohort
  - 75 awards expected
  - Apply by Fall 2018 and enroll at Stanford in Fall 2019

## **Award Benefits**

- Tuition and fees
- Generous stipend for room & board + associated costs
  - On-campus room and board; books, supplies, and instructional materials; health insurance and associated fees; annual travel to and from Stanford; local ground transportation; and reasonable personal expenses
- Extensive opportunities for leadership training, mentoring, and cohort-based experiential learning
  - Multidisciplinary community of Stanford graduate students dedicated to tackling the world's challenges
  - King Global Leadership Program of personal development opportunities, with coaching and feedback, to enhance your skills and hone your voice
  - Mentoring from leaders across geographic and industry sectors in both formal and informal settings

# **Eligibility**

- All citizens welcome\*
  - Over time about one third of KH Scholars will be from the US, about two thirds will be from countries outside the US
  - Numbers will fluctuate from year to year, since their goal is to admit the world's very best students, regardless of location
- Must apply AND MEET the minimum eligibility requirements of your intended, full-time graduate degree program at Stanford
  - For example: JD, MA, MBA, MD, MS, PhD, MD+PhD, JD+MA, or MBA+MS
- First bachelor's degree received in 2014 or later

\*DACA students must check eligibility reqs of their intended graduate program

## **Selection Criteria\***

#### Independence of Thought

 First-step mental sharpness, Seeks out knowledge and new experiences, Full of original ideas, Makes sense of ambiguous situations, & Can hold a contrarian or dissenting point of view

#### Purposeful Leadership

 Ambitious, in the best sense of the word, Driven to improve self, Willing to take risks, Self-aware, & Persists and bounces back from adversity

#### Civic Mindset

Personally humble and kind, Inclusive, Respects differences,
 & Concerned for and helpful to others

\* In addition to what your department seeks in candidates

# **Application Materials**

- 1. Online application for admission
- 2. An unofficial transcript
- 3. Scores on standardized tests for admission, as required by the graduate program that you are pursuing
  - It's helpful & preferred to have the test scores by the time you apply
- 4. Resume / C.V.
  - KH's guideline is one page for every decade of experience
- 5. Two letters of recommendation
  - A non-academic reference
  - An institutional assessment from LMU
- 6. Two personal essays
  - While there are no word limits for these questions, most applicants will find a range of 750 to 1,750 words sufficient
- 7. Two short-answer responses
- 8. A video submission of no more than two minutes
- 9. In-person assessment for finalists, also called the Immersion Weekend

# **Application Materials Continued...**

- Apply separately to your graduate department
  - Don't forget that you still will need to apply separately to the specific Stanford graduate degree program that you want to pursue. This is critical!
  - Some departments may offer fee-waivers to apply
  - Department deadlines will differ from the KH deadline
- KH will receive access to the degree program applications as they are making final decisions on candidates to invite to the Immersion Weekend
  - It's fine if you select the same person(s) to provide recommendations for KH and for your graduate program
  - Ensure that each letter addresses the questions each application requires

### Example: KH Applicant Seeks a Law Degree at Stanford

- REMEMBER: They can't select you as a Knight-Hennessy Scholar if the department doesn't admit you\*
- For Fall 2017 Cohort, Stanford Law received about 3,952 applications and of those, approximately 392 were admitted
  - 75th percentile LSAT score for admitted students: 173
  - 75th percentile GPA for admitted students: 3.95
- Contact faculty and department administrators with admissions questions

\*The department may admit you even if you're not selected as a Knight-Hennessy Scholar

#### Initial Cohort Statistics of the 49 Selected for Fall 2018

- Women comprise 57% of the selected scholars, including 67% of doctoral students in Engineering
- 63% of scholars hold non-U.S. passports, from 19 different countries, including Afghanistan, Argentina, Australia, Canada, China, Colombia, Germany, India, Israel, Italy, Mexico, Myanmar, New Zealand, Nigeria, Romania, South Korea, Syria, Tajikistan, and the United Kingdom
- The scholars earned undergraduate degrees at 37 different institution
- First-generation U.S. citizens comprise 23% of those selected
- First-generation college students comprise 12% of those selected

# **Application Timeline**

May 1:	Application for enrollment for Fall 2019 opens
May- July:	Research and select a graduate program at Stanford
May- July:	Request letters of recommendation
May- July:	Prepare for graduate admissions test(s), if applicable
June- Aug:	Draft your application essays
July 1:	Campus Required Checkpoint- Submit Intent to Apply form
July 10:	Optional Applicant Workshop Webinar at 12pm
July-Sept:	Take graduate admissions test(s), if applicable
August 31:	Campus Deadline- submit application package to ONIF
Sept 11-15:	TENTATIVE- Campus interviews
Sept 28:	TENTATIVE- Knight-Hennessy national deadline is 1pm PST*
