# Newman Civic Fellowship

- ▶ A yearlong program that supports community-committed students who are changemakers and public problem-solvers
- ▶ Fellows are nominated by their president or chancellor on the basis of their potential for public leadership.
- ▶ LMU may award **ONE** Newman Civic Fellow for 2021-2022



# Newman Civic Eligibility

- ▶ Open to undergraduate students of all majors
- ▶ Must be an enrolled student during the 2021-2022 academic year
  - *Students graduating in Spring 2021 or Fall 2021 are not eligible*



# Newman Civic Proposal Example

*“I will be partnering with the university to do research on how we can increase the number of opportunities offered to foster youth who are interested in one day attending. I am also working with and a member of the on-campus program Guardian Scholars, where I guide the success of the program to effectively help mentor youth that may have aged out of the system or are still in the system. This program is on campus and focuses on providing youth who have aged out of the system or still may be in the system resources to help during their time as a college student such as food, money for books, and housing during breaks. LMU has allowed me to broaden my future ideas for my non-profit organization Spark Your Future to not only a local scale but one day be effective politically and help change policy reform for foster youth nationally.”*

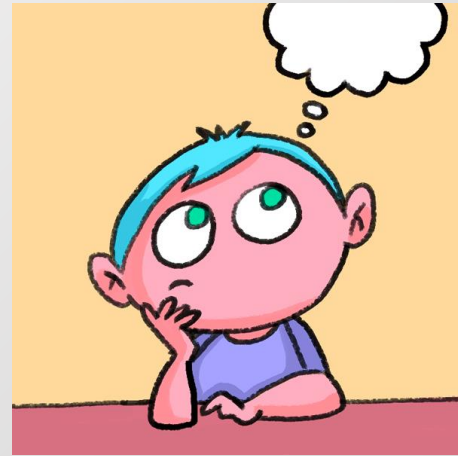
# Newman Civic Fellowship Benefits

- ▶ A national convening of Newman Civic Fellows (travel costs will be covered by LMU)
- ▶ Regional and state gatherings of Newman Civic Fellows
- ▶ Virtual events focused on skill development and professional learning
- ▶ Opportunities to submit conference proposals to present at Campus Compact events
- ▶ Leadership development with a local mentor twice a semester, beginning Fall 2021
- ▶ Participation in a national network of engaged student leaders
- ▶ National recognition through Campus Compact website and media
- ▶ Special scholarship opportunities from the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation & Institute to participate in their Leadership and the American Presidency program

- ▶ Social Issue Statement (max 500 words)
- ▶ Project Statement (max 300 words)
- ▶ Resume or C.V. (max 2-pages)
- ▶ Biography statement (max 150 words)
